



***PROMISING TO DO WHAT THE CONGRESS HAS ALREADY DONE:
THE BJP'S MANIFESTO OF STOLEN IDEAS ON NATIONAL SECURITY***

Summary

The BJP has made a number of promises in its manifesto on the issue of national security that are not only vague, but also merely repetition of ideas that the Congress-led government has already implemented. This suggests one of two possibilities:

1. The BJP endorses the work done by the Congress Party, and is copying the Congress ideas or promising to continue the Congress's successful policies.
 - **If so, the BJP should come out openly and say that it has copied the Congress's ideas and that it applauds the good work done by the Congress Party on these fronts.**
2. The BJP is ignorant of the steps that have been taken by the Congress government in these areas, perhaps because of the BJP's poor track record of participating in parliamentary proceedings.
 - **If this is the case, the BJP should come out openly and admit that it was not aware of the steps taken by the government in these areas.**

The work is on and would be completed by 2011-12.</p>

<p>Coastal security will be strengthened for better patrolling of Indian waters and preventing terrorists from taking the sea route to enter India. A National Maritime Authority will be set up to coordinate coastal security.</p>	<p>Coastal Security Scheme has already been implemented from the year 2005-06. It aims at strengthening infrastructure for patrolling and surveillance of coastal areas.</p> <p>Implemented in all the coastal States and Union Territories.</p> <p>Assistance given to set up 73 coastal police stations with police personnel trained in maritime activities and equipped with boats, jeeps and motor cycles.</p> <p>Assistance has been given to Coast Guard to acquire 15 Interceptor Boats for close coastal patrolling</p> <p>3 additional Coast Guard Stations being set up at a cost of Rs.343 cr.</p>

India will engage with the world in the global war on terror while not compromising on its domestic interests.</p>	<p>Congress has successfully employed diplomacy in dealing with Pakistan after Mumbai attacks.</p> <p>The world has successfully been engaged by the UPA government while dealing with terrorism from the Pakistan soil.</p> <p><u>If BJP also aims to employ the same tactics, then why is it critical of the UPA government' handling</u></p>

What BJP promises	Congress has already done
<p>The Centre will facilitate better inter-State coordination and real-time intelligence-sharing, apart from helping States to raise anti-insurgency forces, to face the threat posed by Maoists. The 'Chhattisgarh Model' will be used for counter-Maoist operations. At the same time, every effort will be made to address the social and economic issues that make the ground fertile for Left-wing extremism.</p>	<p>A new scheme for filling infrastructure gaps in naxal affected States has been prepared at an outlay of Rs.500 crores and a provision of Rs. 100 crore has been kept for 2008-09.</p> <p>NREGA, the Scheduled Tribes and other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006, Backward Regions Grant Fund are the significant steps taken by the UPA government.</p> <p>Other steps taken by UPA are:</p> <p>(a) Fair and firm land administration, with attention on proper maintenance of land records, expeditious recording of mutations and fair disposal of land disputes.</p> <p>(b) Appropriate mechanisms for grievance redressal, public contact and awareness, for creating an overall positive environment and confidence of the people in the State administrative machinery.</p> <p>The failure of the BJP's "Chhattisgarh Model" has been dealt separately.</p> <p><u>Let BJP explain what else it proposes to do in this direction</u></p>
